Online Access with Assistive Technology	On-Site Embossed Files	Paper Braille
Students are able to access the online assessments via screen reader software and a refreshable braille display. All graphics have alternative text descriptions	It is recommended that test administrators emboss files onsite as the students take the assessments. This is especially important for Mathematics assessments.	Smarter Balanced also provides the option of testing with a paper version of the assessments. Check with your state regarding this option.

CHOOSING BRAILLE CODE AND FORMAT

Smarter Balanced has various braille codes available to meet the needs of students taking the assessments with braille. Each student who uses braille is unique in their braille needs and preferences. Some students are early braille readers and may need to use braille that does not contain contractions (symbols in braille that shorten the length of text) while other more experienced braille readers will use braille with contractions. Smarter Balanced provides all of the available braille codes in both uncontracted and contracted forms.
